

COMMERCIAL CANNABIS ACTIVITY PERMIT (CCAP) INFORMATION

Cannabis activities are allowed in the City's **Cannabis Activity Zone (CIZ)** on West End Road and environs. A larger map, with a list of all parcels in the CIZ can be found on the City's website – www.cityofarcata.org.



TYPES OF ALLOWED PERMITS

Manufacturer 1. Production using nonvolatile solvents. Type 6 State license required.

Manufacturer 2. Production using volatile solvents. Type 7 State license required.

Testing Laboratory. Type 8 State license required.

Retailer. All activities for which a Type 10 State license is required. Needs State Seller's permit.

Distributor. All activities for which a Type 11 State license is required.

Distributor – Transport Only. Type 13 State license required.

Microbusiness. All activities for which a Type 12 State license is required.

Cultivation:

Type 1: specialty, outdoor, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 1A: specialty, indoor, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 1B: specialty, mixed light, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 1C: specialty, cottage, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 2: outdoor, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 2A: indoor, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 2B: mixed light, small $\leq 5,000$ SF

Type 3: outdoor, medium 5,001 – 10,000 SF

Type 3A: indoor, medium 5,001 – 10,000 SF

Type 3B: mixed light, medium 5,001 – 10,000 SF

Type 4: nursery

No Type: processing

CCAP PROCESS

1. Begins with complete application (work does not begin until the City has a complete application).
2. Routed through 6 different City departments for compliance review.
3. Construction and Tenant Improvement approvals and buildout generally take longest.
4. Equipment review and approval is also required.
5. Executed inventory track and trace agreement is required prior to permit issuance.
6. Permit is issued when all departments have verified compliance with requirements.

SUCCESSFUL APPLICATIONS have all forms and checklists completed, include an electronic copy of the application, and include fees. **Follow checklists A – E to ensure a complete application.**
